NORFOLK STABBING PKG:

(JOMARIE)

We begin with a story new tonight--

(JOMARIE)

(BAM1)

A man reported dead in Norfolk just this morning.

Police found his body with stab wounds-in the colonial place neighborhood.

Maya Thames went to the scene and has more information along with a resident's reaction.

(TAKE PKG)

(MAYA)

"I'm here on the corner of 38th street and Bluestone Avenue. Police say they were called here just before 6 am for reports of a man stabbed to death."

(PKG)

(MAYA)

101_5401

It happened here early Sunday morning nearly an hour before the--

church doors opened--right across the street.

Many of the street's residents did not hear anything going on outside-or even realize what happened.

(Jennifer West, Resident)

"No, I haven't heard anything. I didn't know until you said something."

(MAYA)

I spoke with 38th street resident Jennifer West who lives just doors down from where the body was found.

For her-- this situation is not typical.

(Jennifer West, Resident)

"Yeah that's not likely around here. That doesn't happen."

18;51;17-18;51;25

"It's usually pretty quiet and pretty calm. I walk to the store at nighttime and I've never had any issues or any problems."

(MAYA)

Now this has left West uneasy.

(Jennifer West, Resident)

"Nervous and scary--not wanting to go outside ... yeah."

18;52;16-18;52;18 "I walk a lot around here."

(MAYA)

In fact--she was outside the night before.

(Jennifer West, Resident) 18;52;08-18;52;13 " I walked to the store in the dark. So yeah, it could've been me I guess."

(MAYA)

But West says that police are usually good with patrolling the neighborhood.

(Jennifer West, Resident)

18;52;51-18;52;58

"Yeah and you do see police a lot riding through and going slow and checking things out. So yeah, they're pretty good about that."

(MAYA)

But does this one crime change her perspective on the neighborhood?

(Jennifer West, Resident)

"No not really because I know that not everybody is like that."

(MAYA)

Here's her solution on what the community can do.

(Jennifer West, Resident)

"Probably more people watching out. Maybe more lights 'cause it is pretty dark at night."

Police are still trying to figure out what happened here and why. At this point-- police have not released any information about the suspect or the victim. If you know anything call the crimeline at 888-LOCK-U-UP In Norfolk. Maya Thames--Ten on your side.

VIRGINIA BEACH MURDER UPDATE:

(JOMARIE)

New information on the Virginia Beach murder that happened on the 900 block of Westminister Lane.

(OTS)

The suspect is 31-year-old Brandon Wyatt Wysong of Virginia Beach.

(BOARD)

He's facing murder and multiple gun charges--

Wysong is being held in the city's jail.

(TAKE VO)

The victim's name has not been released. But--the victim's 11 year-old daughter saw everything--And even tried to stop the bleeding.

LEAD LEVELS VIRGINIA BEACH SCHOOLS:

(JOMARIE)

(OTS)

Lead exposure may now put students' health at risk

(TAKE VO)

Unsafe lead levels were found in 27 Virginia Beach public schools.

Officials detected the lead in drinking and food prep sources.

Families received an alert from the superintendent after the water testing.

The Centers for Disease Control says there are no safe lead blood levels for children. Their call to action--

All lead exposed sources should be controlled or eliminated. More updates to come.

NORFOLK EMERGENCY LANDING:

(JOMARIE)

(OTS)

A Southwest airplane-- made an emergency landing at Norfolk International.

(TAKE VO)

The plane departed from Baltimore/Washington International Airport. Soon after-- worries sparked of potential smoke in the cabin of Flight 811. Turns out it was a coffee pot that set a small fire--but was put out before landing. Everyone was safe and transferred to a different aircraft--Leaving them over two hours behind on their flight to Punta Cana.

ODU SEXUAL ASSAULT PKG:

(JOMARIE)

(OTS)

We have more coverage on a local University's sexual assault report. According to an O-D-U safety alert-- one happened last Friday night around 8:45 The incident took place on west 49th street-- just blocks from Hampton Boulevard. Students know the facility as Rogers Complex.

(WAVY 10 ANIMATION)

10 on your side's Maya Thames went over to Old Dominion today.

(DEVELOPING NEWS ANIMATION)

(TAKE PKG)

(Anonymous Student Interview)

(Anonymous Student)

(11;30;58) "I don't feel safe. Like it's scary."

(MAYA)

The repeated incidents of sexual assault have shaken students at O-D-U.

(Student)

(11;30;16)

"... like I'll turn my head over my shoulder sometimes just walk fast try to hurry up and get to my dorm."

(MAYA)

Today I spoke with an O-D-U freshmen who expressed her worry.

An O-D-U safety alert was sent out to students warning them of the reported sexual assault. But even before that-some students already knew.

(Student)

(11;24;25)

"I was baffled. I was really hurt by it because...I found out through twitter. I didn't find out through the school. I didn't find out through our President, Roddrick."

(MAYA)

The student feels like the University is not properly handling the incident.

(Student)

(11;24;47)

"It made me feel like the school doesn't care. They recently sent out an email about one of their faculty members receiving a hate crime...and including the FBI and the police. But they didn't say anything about the rape that happened or anything."

(MAYA)

These actions did not reassure this student. Who can she turn to in times of trouble?

(Student)

(11;26;31)

"I mean the only person I feel like I can really talk to is my mom. That's it."

(MAYA)

However--on campus she says she can depend on others.

(Student)

(11;26;39)

"...the other students on campus--they're here to help more than the president of the school, you know like professors and stuff--the students care more."

(MAYA)

The student has also taken a strong stance against the incident.

(Student)

(11;27;47)

"And I feel like--no is no. No girl should go through that at all. It doesn't matter if they like the guy, their boyfriend, girlfriend--it does not matter. No is no."

(MAYA)

And she has specific security expectations of the University.

(Student)

(11;30;48)

I feel like it should be very increased. Police should be increased, and cameras should be increased."

(MAYA)

But if not--she's considering making a move to take matters into her own hands.

(Student)

(11;32;02)

"If it keeps happening, and nothing gets done then it is a very high possibility of me transferring.Yes."

(MAYA)

(TAG)

We mentioned an O-D-U safety alert was sent after the incident was reported. Back in September when an assault was reported-- no alert was sent. O-D-U police reasoning-- "no continuing threat to the campus community."

"You want a trial?"

Pres. Trump:

"Oh, I would."

"They gave the server to CrowdStrike or whatever it's called which is a company owned by a very wealthy Ukrainian. And I still want to see the server."

Dr. Fiona Hill/ Former White House Top Russia Expert:

"This is a fictional narrative that has been perpetrated and propagated by the Russian security services themselves."

That last comment refers to the President's theory of "CrowdStrike" hacking the D-N-C's server.

According to NBC news-- the cybersecurity firm is not owned by "a wealthy Ukranian"--But is a California based company hired by the D-N-C.

The President also mentions that in light of the hearings-- he's inviting an impeachment trial.

But the fate of a trial lies in the hands of the House--controlled by the Democrats.
