## September 25, 2019-

### Drone Drop Off:

An inmate in an Ohio county jail received a drone drop off delivery.

Surveillance video caught the drone dropping the package at the jail's outdoor recreation complex.

Inside the special delivery-- marijuana and a cell phone.

This happened back in June at the CUYAHOGA County Jail.

The prosecutor's office is now reviewing the case.

It has not been determined if criminal charges will be made.

## Low-aspirin therapy:

Pregnant women have been discouraged from using aspirin for years. But now two organizations are advising low dose aspirin therapy-- specifically for women at risk of pre-eclampsia.

The American College of OB/GYNS and the U-S preventive services task took this stance. Pre-eclampsia causes a spike in the mother's blood pressure and damage to organs-- putting her and her baby at risk.

The therapy can prevent blood clotting and poses no significant risk.

Mother's allergic to aspirin or similar drugs should first talk to their doctors.

# NY Rockland County Measles Outbreak:

The measles outbreak is now over in New York's Rockland County.

This was just one of the 12 hundred and 41 cases in 31 states that have been confirmed.

More than 75 percent were connected to outbreaks in New York.

In most cases these people were not vaccinated.

No newly found cases have been reported since August 13th.

### Former Police Officer Amber Guyger Found Guilty:

Update on the case where a Dallas Police Officer entered her neighbor's apartment--shot and killed him.

Yesterday 26-year-old Amber Guyger was found guilty for the murder. But Guyger's text message history has delayed her sentencing. The prosecution claims these texts show that Guyger is a racist. The messages were prohibited for review during the trial. Now--the judge is considering them for sentencing. Guyger faces up to life in prison.
